## **Fundraiser Puts Fremont Harley Owners Group Over One-Half Million Dollar Mark For Hackley Cancer Center**

**Muskegon, MI** - Following a motorcycle run from Fremont to Muskegon on Saturday, July 26, the 202-member Fremont Harley Owners Group (HOG) presented a \$74,500 check to officials at the Hackley Cancer Center. The check, a result of the 2003 Sandy Corley Memorial Run which was held in June, brings the ten year total of funds donated to Hackley Hospital's Cancer Center to \$548,728.

States Lucinda Wiseman, Director of Cancer Services at Hackley Hospital, "These funds represent a lasting and loving tribute to a very special man, Sandy Corley. This annual fundraiser makes a profound difference in hundreds of lives of cancer patients throughout West Michigan. Words cannot describe how special the Fremont HOG members are to this community."

Because of the Fremont HOG's generosity, hundreds of patients have received the following benefits at the Hackley Cancer Treatment Center:

- Services from a state-of-the-art cancer treatment planning computer system.
- Coupled with the center's new \$1.3 million linear accelerator, patients now receive state-of-the-art radiation therapy known as Conformal Radiation Therapy and Intensity Modulated Radiation Therapy.
- Services from a new CT scan machine made available to cancer patients.
- Pain management assistance and medication assistance for patients in need.
- Computerized patient and family education.

Sandy Corley opened Sandy's Harley Davidson Sports Center in 1976 in Fremont. He loved motorcycles and the people who rode them. Sandy passed away on June 29, 1989, at the age of 61 from cancer. Each year the Fremont Harley Owners Group hosts a cancer fundraiser in memory of this beloved man.

The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Sandy Corley Memorial Run was held on June 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup>. Highlights of the weekend included a motorcycle run between Fremont and Mears, a custom painted Harley Davidson Softail raffle bike, live auction, a headliner concert by Night Ranger, Mountain and Chance Encounter, and a fireworks extravaganza.
